All Volunteers are Required to do the Civil Rights/ Confidentiality Training

This may sound like a broken record, but have you completed the Civil Rights/Confidentiality Training??? All volunteers are required to do this, because it is important we understand how our actions can influence our clients.



It is important that we serve and treat everyone equally. Consequently, every year the Oregon Food Bank requires volunteers to review the Civil Rights & Confidentiality Training and sign that they have reviewed the information.

We are asking all individual/group/Church volunteers to once again complete this training. This can happen in two ways. You can review the Civil Rights brochure, which is available on the registration desk or at the Hood River site, it is also on the back desk. Take a few minutes when you come to work or when there is a break to read this information. Then there is a form to sign the form that you have completed the training.

An even better way to get the training is to watch a quick Civil Rights video. It is a very

good video and only about 20 minutes. To find this video, go to the Hood River FISH website at <u>https://www.fish-food-bank.com</u>, once at the website click on More,

then go to <u>Current Volunteers</u>, then go to <u>Civil Rights Training</u>.

Once you have watched the video you can sign the form at FISH.

The goal is to have all volunteers complete this training by the end of March. This is an important requirement as it is part of the Oregon Food Bank review each year. OFB do ask to see our forms that the volunteers sign. So please help make this happen.

Third week of lent

"Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." Matthew 23:12

Humility seems like such a contradiction. We are easily tempted to think that the way to greatness involves letting everyone know all that we do well. There is a constant temptation for most people to put forward their best face and to hope



others will see that and admire it. We want to be noticed and praised. And we often try to make that happen by the little things we do and say. And often we tend to exaggerate who we are.

On the flip side, if someone criticizes us and thinks ill of us it has the potential of being devastating. If we hear that someone said something negative about us we may go home and be depressed or angry about it the rest of the day, or even the rest of the week! Why? Because our pride is wounded and that wound can hurt. It can hurt unless we have discovered the incredible gift of humility.

Humility is a virtue that enables us to be real. It enables us to cut through any false persona we may have and simply be who we are. It enables us to be comfortable with our good qualities as well as our failures. Humility is nothing other than being honest and true about our lives and being comfortable with that person.

Jesus gives us a wonderful lesson in the passage above, that is very hard to live but is absolutely key to living a happy life. He wants us to be exalted! He wants us to be noticed by others. He wants our light of goodness to shine for all to see and for that light to make a difference. But He wants it done in truth, not by presenting a false persona. He wants the real "me" to shine forth. And that is humility.

Reflect, today, on how genuine you are. Make this time of Lent a time when the foolishness of pride is shattered. Let God strip away every false image of yourself so that the true you can shine forth. Humble yourself in this way and God will take you and exalt you in His way so that your heart can be seen and loved by those around you.

During our worship services in the season of Lent we have added a few things. There is singing at 10:20am before worship to practice the new hymns we are introducing every Sunday. (Thank you to those who come early to run through them and to our musicians for leading them.) There's the call to worship where we center ourselves, preparing for worship and its various components. There's the prayer of confession where we share honestly about where we need forgiveness and connection with God. There are the words of assurance that speak to the fact that even with the brokenness in our lives we are loved and valued



by God. There is the artwork on the front of the bulletin that provides an opportunity to color and focus in a deeper way.

All of these new additions are to bring our attention to this important season of the church year. It is to set it apart from the time that surrounds it. It is to move us closer to God and strengthen our spiritual journey. With that, pay attention to which of these new aspects speak to you. Let them be a guide of nourishment and sustenance. Let them help you connect with God as we continue to move towards spiritual hydration as our Lenten theme highlights.
